**Community Day of Service Slated for January 14, 2017. At 10 am volunteers with their kit donations are invited to meet at the Saranac Lake Adult Center, located at 135 Broadway, to assemble the kits. Later that day at 7:00 pm, a Martin Luther King Coffee House Celebration in the Great Hall of the Presbyterian Church will feature the music of Crowfeather and the Rustic Riders, the stories of indigenous youth, and the words of Dr. King. A free-will donation will be received to help cover the CWS processing fee of \$2.00 per kit, which allows for distribution worldwide. The kits components are: hand towels measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber), washcloths, wide-tooth combs, fingernail or toenail clippers, bath-size bars of soap in the wrapper, toothbrushes in the package, and standard size Band-Aids. **A report from the MINC Emergency fund In the past few weeks, we have received requests for assistance with rental deposits, gas deposits, and preventing electrical shutoffs. In all of these situations, folks were referred to us by other agencies and businesses- the Northern Regional Center for Independent Living in Watertown, Catholic Charities in Ogdensburg, the Neighbor Center in Gouverneur and St. Lawrence Gas. One woman was referred to us by NRCIL because she needed to have a new place to live. The situation in her present apartment was not healthy for her and her family. The NRCIL caseworker vouched for her, and together they found a new apartment. The client needed \$600 for a security deposit, and we usually help with only \$200 per family. With our commitment for part of the deposit, the client was able to obtain funding from other agencies to meet the deposit amount. The caseworker realized that no agency would pay for the actual move, so she and her husband and some other volunteers moved the family the next weekend.**

**It is not unusual for the MINC Emergency Fund to partner with agencies in both counties to meet the needs of individuals and families. Partnering keeps us all connected with each other's programs. We appreciate your support- both with prayer and financial.**
