Dear Presbytery Friends,

What a year this has been! We pray this finds you safe and well despite the spread of Covid-19 that is currently on the rise in the North Country.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, our churches have been faithfully responding to the safety needs of its members and the surrounding communities by ceasing in-person gatherings and when/if re-opening, doing so with utmost care and concern for the well-being of all involved. Many of you pivoted to online worship and while not completely satisfying, God has been at work in new ways. "Flexibility," "adaptation," "Zoom," and "rapid change" are the buzz words for describing ministry in 2020.

For the Presbytery, 2020 was the first of a three-year plan to "Sustain the Dream" of having a Resource Presbyter to support and guide us into the future. Thanks to a majority of congregations pledging their support, totaling just over \$32k, we are ending the year without the need for an extra transfer from investments! Thank you also for meeting or exceeding our goals for MINC and the Watertown Multi-Ethnic Community!

As we look to 2021, we know this time of uncertainty will continue to impact our ministries throughout the North Country. We also believe that having a Resource Presbyter has been very important during this time. In light of the wonderful response in 2020 [without significant follow up that was planned], the Coordinating Council has set an ambitious goal of \$61,000 for 2021 (MINC \$10k, WMEC \$6k & Sustaining the Dream \$45k).

Included with this letter, you will find a 2021 Presbytery Pledge Form indicating your Per Capita Assessment for 2021 and a place to indicate your Mission Pledge. This year, we are including the "Sustaining the Dream" pledge under the umbrella of the presbytery mission pledge. This change reflects our belief that presbytery resourcing and support for congregations has a direct impact on the mission and ministry of our congregations. This is especially true for those going through a time of transition.

We hope you will consider giving to all three using the percentage formula presented, or you may designate your gifts in a manner most fitting for your congregation.

Thank you for your commitment to the ministry and mission of Jesus Christ across the Presbytery of Northern New York. Please do reach out if we can assist in interpreting any of these materials.

# **PNNY Mission Support Opportunities in 2021**

For the past decade, General Mission giving in the presbytery has been slowly declining, yet the desire to support mission beyond the doors of our churches remains strong. In response to this decline and with an eye on future sustainability of PNNY's strong mission emphasis, the Coordinating Council decided that we will only receive mission offerings directly related to the presbytery and encourage churches to directly fund the **Regional/Malawi Mission Partners** and PC(USA) Mission & Churchwide Offerings noted on the following pages..

#### For 2021, the **Presbytery Mission Pledge** will go to support the following three initiatives:

- 1. MINC [\$10,000 goal] Each summer Ministry in the North Country supervises work groups [in 2020, there were no large groups, only small ones] who repair rooves, add ramps and in other ways make homes warmer, safer, and drier for families who are ineligible for bank loans or public assistance and living in some of the most isolated parts of Lewis, St. Lawrence, and Jefferson counties. This is the Rural Rehab part of MINC. Mission dollars from the presbytery goes to purchase materials and pays for the supervision and organization of Rural Rehab. Mission dollars also pays the stipend for the Outreach Coordinator, who handles applications to the Emergency Fund, confirming need and networking with other agencies to coordinate aid. In this way all the money donated to the Emergency Fund can go directly to applicants.
- 2. Watertown Multi-Ethnic Community [\$6,000 goal]. This new church plant is part of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s 1001 New Worshipping Communities movement and began under the leadership of our own Rev. Sarah Lee in May of 2017. The Presbytery endorsed this mission endeavor and after two years, the Administrative Commission formed to come alongside in support was dissolved as the WMEC now has its own leadership team. After three plus years, the WMEC continues to be a vital presence among the various ethnic people who are not large enough to have their own church community. This ministry has received support from the General Assembly, Synod of the Northeast, and several PNNY churches in addition to presbytery mission funds. This funding is critical to support the worship, hospitality and service to the community this ministry provides. - 3. **Sustaining the Dream Campaign [\$45,000 goal].** Last year the presbytery embarked on a mission to Sustain the Dream" of our current staffing model through a presbytery pledge. After great success in 2020, despite Covid-19, and the realization that the Resource Presbytery position facilitates and supports mission throughout the region, the Coordinating Council is now including this as part of the mission pledge. Your giving to support the Sustaining the Dream campaign will enable us to continue the model that is having a direct impact on churches as they seek to be effective in their mission and ministry context. # **PNNY Regional Mission Partners**

In 2021 the Coordinating Council invites you to consider <u>direct support to the organizations previously</u> <u>supported with general mission dollars from your pledges.</u>

- Watertown Urban Mission [\$6,000 was given in 2019] WUM has many programs serving the people of Jefferson County. The Bridge Program offers opportunities for individuals in trouble with the law to get their lives on track. The Hearth Program helps families find stable housing. In addition, Urban Mission has a Critical Needs program, a Food Pantry, a Christian Care drop-in center, the Impossible Dream thrift store, and has recently joined with Meals on Wheels. Urban Mission budget for 2015 was \$1.573 million. Of that, administrative expenses are under 10%. - Helping Hands of Potsdam, Inc. [\$2,000 was given in 2019] This group provides money for power, money for heat after HEAP runs out, gives firewood, and provides used cars to working families. They have a chef and serve lunch four days a week. - Church and Community [\$2,000 was given in 2019] Church and Community, in Canton, operates a food pantry and thrift shop downtown and gives referrals for other services. This group has been operating since 1974 and now has an \$80,000 a year budget. - Samaritan House [\$5,000 was given in 2019] Since 2017, this transitional housing center in Saranac Lake gives temporary housing and help in finding permanent homes to those in need in Franklin and Essex Counties. The organization provides referrals to community resources that lead to self-sufficiency and stability, job training and a return to a normal, productive life.
